Following his army service, Korean War veteran Harry Redlick started teaching and coaching at San Francisco's George Washington High School in 1957. During his 22 years of coaching, 11 athletes established city records, and his teams won 24 city championships, with 21 victories for Varsity Track & Field and three for Cross Country. He also coached the San Francisco section for three California Interscholastic Federation meets. In 1992, Harry was inducted into the George Washington High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

After retiring in 1990, Harry served 16 years as a Trustee on the San Bruno elementary School Board and nine years on the San Bruno Planning Commission. He was also elected to the San Bruno City Council. As a volunteer for the American Lung Association (ALA), Harry was appointed to its Board of Directors, elected President of the San Mateo/San Francisco chapter and later the State Board of Directors, and spent three years on the ALA's National Council.

A Lincoln High School graduate, Harry earned a B.S. and M.A. from San Francisco State University in Physical Education. While at SF State, Harry was Sophomore Class President, Student Body Treasurer, Homecoming Chairman, President of the Block S Society, and lettered in Football, Soccer, Track, and Boxing. He and his wife Joan celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary in 2016. He now works as a tour guide in the Bay Area and throughout California and the western states.
