HUBERMAN, Isac Isac Huberman beloved husband, father, cousin and friend passed away on October 5, 2015 in Dallas, Texas at the age of 70. He is survived by the love of his life, Vicki Levitt Huberman; and his children, Stephanie Marlin Huberman and Louis Dustin Huberman, whom he adored.

Isac was born on July 1, 1945 in Lublin, Poland. He moved to Buenos Aires, Argentina with his family when he was 4 years old. Just after Isac turned 11, he contracted polio.

He was then sent to San Francisco, to live with relatives, where he could receive medical care at Shriner's Hospital. He had countless surgeries and spent a great deal of time in the hospital but he never let anything, let alone polio, stand in his way of achieving all he sought to do in life. He rose above, in spite of some lingering physical limitations, and soared in every aspect of his life.

Isac graduated from the esteemed Lowell High School in San Francisco, CA and matriculated from the University of California at Berkeley, where he received both his undergraduate degree and MBA.

Isac worked as a financial analyst and stockbroker, researching companies all over the world. His meticulous reports and diligent research was highly regarded by many, especially the institutional sector.

In the late 1970's, Isac moved to Dallas to focus on the oil and gas business. He attained overwhelming accolades for his writing and professional contributions to the business.

In addition to his professional work, Isac was a dedicated and active member of the Jewish community serving both as an active board member of the Dallas Holocaust Center in the 1980's; as well as a founding member of Congregation Nishmat Am in Plano, Texas.

On September 18, 1983, the day after Yom Kippur, Isac and Vicki met. They were devoted to one another and were married five months later on

Valentine's Day, 1984, in San Francisco, CA. While on vacation in Hawaii, in the 1990's, they renewed their vows.

Isac was larger than life. His exuberance and love was contagious to everyone around him. Fluent in five languages, he loved to talk to people. Nobody told a story quite like Isac! He had the biggest heart, was totally selfless, sincere, and unpretentious. Isac never complained, and always focused on the positive in life, all the while providing unconditional support and love to friends and family alike. He was blessed with circles of friends from all different countries and walks of life. His charisma, charm, and warmth made everyone feel welcomed and cherished. He was a role model for everyone in his life, teaching by example, that the only thing that defines you in life is how you stand up, and never how many times or how hard you fall. Most notably, Isac possessed a most unique sense of humor. If he was not asking you to "tell me something," he was the ultimate wordsmith, as his vernacular was replete with many "Isac-isms." Some we will cherish fondly including: "I don't know what's killing me more, the stock market or the cancer!" "If anybody names a child after me, please give him two a's (Isaac), as I was cheated out of an "a" and a middle name;" and "My name is Isac Huberman, how do you like me so far?" Our answer will forever be "we love you, always."

His loving cousins, Martin Kramer of Key West, Florida, Dr. Adam & Betina Baumgarten and their children, Zachary and Gabrielle of Greenbrae, California, and Aunt Maxine Oleshansky of Aventura, Florida; and his devoted rescue dog, Havana, a fixture by his side always, and especially during his illness, also survive Isac.
