Richard "Rick" Plato, aged 78, a longtime resident of San Francisco, passed away peacefully on April 11, 2024. Born and raised in San Francisco, Rick was a man of honor and integrity, known for his unwavering dedication to his family, friends, and country.

Rick served with distinction in the United States Navy and will be laid to rest at Sacramento Valley National Cemetery with Veteran's honors.

As owner of Plato's Dental Lab for 54 years, he received the nickname of the "Mayor of Judah Street."

He leaves behind a loving family, including his wife, Kendall "Candy" Plato; their children, James, Tiffany and their families, and Rick's twin brother, Roger Plato and wife, Ruth. 

Richard "Rick" Plato, aged 78, a long-time resident of San Francisco, passed away peacefully on April 11, 2024, in <u>Concord, California</u>. Born and raised in San Francisco, Rick was a man of honor and integrity, known for his unwavering dedication to his family, friends, and country.

Rick served with distinction in the United States Navy from April 1963 to October 1967, a period of his life that shaped his enduring commitment to fellow veterans and the values of service and community. Following his military service, Rick channeled his meticulous nature into his career as the owner and operator of Plato's Dental Laboratory, where he was respected for his craftsmanship and business integrity. In honor of his service he will be laid to rest at Sacramento Valley National Military Cemetery in a private ceremony with Veteran's honors.

Rick's dedication to his work was only surpassed by his dedication to his family and friends. He was the first to call or text those that touched his life with a celebratory greeting. Rick always enjoyed spending time with family around the pool or any other body of water. His love of water started when he spent summers running concessions at Russian River with his twin brother Roger. He loved sharing time with others. When Rick had a family of his own, he would spend summers at Lake Berryessa teaching friends and family how to water ski and how to get thrown off a tube. His greatest joy was the honor of being Papa Rick to his grandchildren but also by his chosen family of

children and grandchildren. Rick and his wife Candy created a welcoming life to all those who needed love and support. His legacy as a servant leader will continue through the lives he touched.

A man of diverse interests and talents, Rick was an avid supporter of the San Francisco Giants, a passion he shared with his family and friends. His love for classic cars, boating, gardening and sharing the fruit from his citrus trees became a source of pride and joy. Rick's community spirit was shown through his volunteer work at local theaters, through charities and spending his time with his grandchildren at their schools and after school activities. He earned the endearing nicknames of the "Mayor of Judah Street" and the "King of Spare Parts" through his ability to always watch out for others and help those around him. He was a proud Eagle Scout and took pride in hearing his loved ones exclaim "Papa can fix it!"


